#### Being a Light in the World

In the gospel this weekend John presents us with a striking dichotomy between light and darkness. This of course is connected to the way we choose to live our lives, either in darkness or in the light. John tells us

"whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God." John shows us that our faith is never meant to be hidden. The same message is apparent in Matthew 5:14-16, "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." Part of our mission as disciples of Christ is to bring our faith out into the world. We are all blessed in different ways with different gifts and talents. Jesus challenges us, not to hide our gifts, but to use them as a way to be a light to others.

From Ephesians this week we hear, "For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them." From our baptism, and even from the way God created us, we are called to produce good works in Christ and live in them. Our faith is not to be hidden but rather lived out in every aspect of our life. We are called to live authentically in truth and light, meaning we are called to be beacons of faith and hope to all those we encounter. Pope Francis tells us, "For me this word is very important. Encounter with others. Why? Because faith is an encounter with Jesus and we must do what Jesus does: encounter others." As members of the Body of Christ we are called to form relationships with one another, and as Pope Frances says, we are called to "create a culture of encounter"."

During this season of Lent, we encourage you to reflect and think about how you are called to be a light in the world. What can you do to share your faith with others? What can you do to have a meaningful and fruitful encounter with someone this week? If you don't know where to start, try looking at our website or contact the parish office for a list of ministries here at St. Patrick. Bring this list of ministries to prayer and consider where God might be calling you to be a light in the world.

#### Stewardship

Oftentimes, when things don't go according to our best-laid plans, we begin to question God. We may question his faithfulness, his love, or his goodness. Sometimes we even question his existence, assuming that if God does exist, he'd never allow us to suffer any type of discomfort or hardship. The children of Judah, the southern kingdom of Israel, certainly felt that way when they were invaded, enslaved, and deported by their foreign captures during the time we refer to as the Babylonian Exile. For decades, they cried out to God, wondering how a loving deity could let anything like this befall them, regardless of the repeated prophetic warnings they had previously received. We hear in this backstory in the first reading for this week, as 2 Chronicles recount the dark days of their not-too-distant past. Quickly, though, we shifted gears to the good news of their impending release under the Persian king, Cyrus. We see God moving through a pagan heart to accomplish this great good. We are reminded that God's plan is perfect and plays out in God's way and on God's timetable.

This is the theme that St. Paul is driving home to the people of Ephesus in the second reading: God had a plan. God still has a plan. God's plan is revealed through the ages, as his grace in living and active. God has created us for good works that were "prepared in advance," so that we would presently "live in them." Here we begin to see God's omnipresence even though we live only in the moment or within one era. These elements are an invitation for us to trust the plan of God, especially in those times, when God's plan seems to make little logical sense (as in the gospel when Jesus prophesies his own brutal death). When we live in the truth, we trust in God's promise, and when we are in that truth, we come to the light. So, if you're struggling to trust the Lord, his plan, or his timing at this moment of your faith journey don't lose heart. Millions have had the same struggle over the centuries - you're in good company! The key is to keep your eyes fixed on Christ and your head buried in his Word and sacraments. Time will alleviate all doubt that the God who created you and died for you also has a perfect plan for you. "His handiwork" is a plan "prepared in advance" as we hear in today's second reading.





#### NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH



Dr. Sally Ride 1951-2012

Dr. Sally Ride was the first American woman in space. She made her journey into history on June 18, 1983. Throughout her life, Dr. Ride broke barriers and worked to ensure that girls

and women were encouraged to do the same. She was passionate about improving science, education, and helping young women and girls foster an interest in science.

In 1973, she received a Bachelor of Science in physics and a Bachelor of Arts in English from Stanford University. She continued at Stanford, earning her Master of Science and doctorate degrees in physics in 1975 and 1978.

Dr. Ride subsequently started working at NASA and trained to be a mission specialist on future space flights. Eventually, she was one of five crew members aboard the space shuttle Challenger STS-7. On June 18, 1983, she became the first American woman in space and the youngest American in space at that time. She launched two communication satellites and operated the shuttle's mechanical arm as well as conducted experiments.

On October 5, 1984, Ride went on another shuttle mission- the STS-41G. She spent eight days conducting scientific observations of the Earth. She also worked on refueling techniques for shuttles. After her second mission, Ride worked on investigating the 1986 Challenger accident.

Ride served as the Director of the California Space Science Institute, a research institute of the University of California. She also worked as a physicist and physics professor at the University of California, San Diego. Ride was a member of the President's Committee of Advisors on Science and Technology and served on the Advisory Board of the National Women's History Museum.

One of her endeavors was Imaginary Lines, which supports girls interested in math, science, and technology. She posthumously received the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

She passed away on July 23, 2012 after a 17-month battle with pancreatic cancer. She was 61.




