Tis the Season

It is hard to believe we are already in Advent. Advent marks the start of the new year in the liturgical calendar. It is a time when everyone starts to put up Christmas decorations and when the air starts to feel a little bit cooler. It is a time to spend in the company of family and friends, to enjoy some hot chocolate and maybe some warm tamales, but most importantly it is a time of preparation.

The word "Advent" comes from the latin word Adventus meaning "coming". But what exactly are we preparing for and who is coming? This is a question worth asking over the next four weeks. As we enter into the Advent season we prepare for the birth of Jesus as he entered this world in the humblest of ways. This season is set apart from the rest of the year for a reason and we have a lot of little things that remind us of that. One of my favorites is the Advent wreath.

The Advent wreath is a long-standing Catholic tradition that goes back to the Middle Ages. In the Church we place four candles on the wreath for each Sunday of Advent. The purple candles signify prayer, penance, and good deeds, while the rose candle is lit on the third Sunday signifying our rejoicing that Christ is almost here. The wreath itself is in the shape of a circle and the use of evergreens remind us of the eternity of God. Even the holly and berries are used to signify the crown of thorns and droplets of blood from Jesus. The light on the candle most importantly signifies Christ, the Light of the World. The closer we get to Christmas the

more candles we light and the darkness around begins to dissipate. It is a reminder for us all that even in the darkest of moments, Christ is always lighting our way guiding us.

At the same time during this season we are also challenged to be a source of light and compassion to those around us. If you are looking for a way to be a source of compassion I invite you to consider being a part of our Bags of Compassion Advent Mission. Bags containing useful items will be assembled as a community effort on December 9 at 6:30 pm and will be distributed by parishioners to those experiencing homelessness on Christmas day.

The Advent wreath is a great reminder of what this season is all about. I encourage you, if you don't have an advent wreath, get one and light each candle as we approach Christmas. Maybe you can light it together with your family. Allow it to be a reminder in your life of God's love and his light that always seeks to guide us.









Inspiration, Ideas, and Encouragement for Grandparents

## ADVENT OPPORTUNITIES:

+Advent is the 4-week period leading up to Christmas. We burn candles to remind us that we are preparing for Jesus, the Light of the World. This month, intentionally light a candle whenever your grandchildren come to visit. For example: while you read a story together, play a board game, say a prayer, eat dinner together, etc. As you light the candle, remind your family that Jesus is the reason for the Christmas season.

+Celebrate the Feast of St. Nicholas on December 6th. Have your grandchildren leave their shoes outside your home and fill them with small oranges, chocolate, coins, or an ornament for the tree. Share how Santa Claus can be traced back to this Catholic saint.

+Wreaths were a teaching tool in the early Church. The circular shape represents the circle of life from Jesus' birth till



death. Pointy holly leaves symbolize the crown of thorns and the berries signify His blood and sacrifice for us. The enduring evergreen branches tell of His victory over death and forever love for us. As you see Christmas wreaths this year, stop for a moment and share this message.

## Recipe:

#### THE BEST HOT CHOCOLATE

1 1/2 cups sugar 1 1/4 cups cocoa powder 1/2 - 1 1/4 tsp saft, to taste 3/4 cup hot water

1 gallon milk 1 tsp vanilla extract 1/4 tsp cinnamon



In a large saucepan, combine sugar, cocoa, and salt. Slowly add in hot water, mixing well. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until mixture boils. Boil and stir for 2 minutes. Add milk, stirring occasionally. Do not boil. Remove from heat and whisk in vanilla and cinnamon. Enjoy!

#### **Social Justice**

During the weekend Masses in Advent, we will be collecting socks for our **Annual Sock Drive**. Bins will be placed at the altar where our parishioners and visitors can deposit their gift of socks which will go to nonprofit and faith organizations in our community who help those in need.

If you choose to donate socks for this charitable drive, we kindly ask that you please purchase new/unused socks. They will be collected at weekend Mass services on December 1, 7/8, 14/15, and 21/22.

Our Charity aspect of social justice recognizes that our faith calls all of us to recognize the **Community & Common Good** and to serve those who do not have the very basic and immediate needs for their everyday life. We are asked to give generously from our abundance.

The Justice component of our faith realizes that socks are an afterthought for most people and that this piece of clothing does not seem too significant. However, for those who are unsheltered, socks are a much needed article. Socks wear out very quickly when living on the street. Socks provide warmth, comfort, and play a role in a person's everyday hygiene by helping avoid blisters and bacteria. With this, we recognize the **Dignity of the Person**.

Organizations we will be assisting this year are André House, Paz de Cristo, Justa Center, and CASS (Central Arizona Shelter Services).
