
Good Shepherd Sunday: Knowing the Voice of God

The 4th Sunday of Easter is traditionally called "Good Shepherd Sunday." The name stems from today's gospel taken from the tenth chapter of John. The image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is one of the most recognizable images in Christianity. There is something comforting about the image as it reminds us Jesus is always with us, watching after us, taking care of our needs. The reason we call him the Good Shepherd is because Jesus is willing to lay down his life for us. A shepherd wouldn't be much of a shepherd if he didn't care about his sheep and abandons them. He is called the Good Shepherd because he knows his sheep and his sheep know him.

Usually when someone is called a "sheep" it is used in a negative way. But the reason why the sheep are a good example for us is because they know their shepherd. Sheep can discern between the noises around them and follow only the voice of their shepherd. For a moment, think about all the voices you hear in a day. Think about every show, every song, every politician, every movie, every video on social media. They are all voices leading us in different directions. We get a nonstop stream of voices telling us what we should do and think. The difference between all those voices and the voice of God is the voice of the Good Shepherd will always lead us to true happiness.

If we want to know the Good Shepherd we need to discern out the noise and listen to his voice. Having some silence in our day and making time for prayer is a great place to start.

Another great way to deepen our relationship with God is by forming our own understanding of our faith through various bible studies and prayer groups. There are many available ministries here at St. Patrick designed for this exact purpose: Women's Bible Study, That Man is You, Magis Women, Beyond Sunday Communities, and Walking with Purpose, to name a few. If you are interested in deepening your understanding of God and being better able to discern the voice of God in your life, consider becoming involved in bible study or a prayer group ministry. Stewardship

Dear God, you hear me when I call. When I begin to doubt your presence, let me be reminded that you were always with me, and you fulfill all your promises. When I turn away from you, lead me back to your grace. Help me repent for my sins and shower me with your unending grace and mercy.

God is "the author of life" as we hear in the first reading from Acts. During the speech from St. Peter, we are given a tremendous overview and summation of salvation history. We hear about the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and later about the prophets who were sent to announce Christ's coming. We also hear about the swap for Barabbas "the murderer" and the denial before Pilate. Finally, we hear the formula for eternal life: "Repent, and return, so that your sins may be wiped away." This reads like a CliffsNotes version of the Bible.

As the author of the story of salvation, the Holy Spirit recaps this tale for us in the first reading (through Peter) and in the gospel (through Christ himself as he unpacks the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms). The second reading from St. John furthers this theme when we hear about the role of the Advocate (the Holy Spirit) and what it takes to live a Christian life authentically and virtuously.

The covenants, laws, and prophecies of the Old Testament didn't happen by accident. No, God's plan for our salvation is tangible and practical, unfolding intentionally over the centuries. The story makes sense because it was the purposeful design of its author, the "author of life" who God raised from the dead.

Social Justice

It is that time of year when our extreme weather affects the most vulnerable in our population - those who are experiencing homelessness or those who lack access to clean drinking water. Nobody should be denied the most basic and necessary resource of water in order to survive. Without water, life does not exist.

Through our Annual Water Drive here at St. Patrick Catholic Community we have the option to step forward and assist organizations like André House, St. Vincent de Paul, and the City of Phoenix who serve the wider population of those who struggle with their everyday basic needs. Because of our partnerships with these organizations, the water that we collect here at St. Patrick will assist over 30 different agencies and their clients throughout the Valley!!

Our faith invites us to care for the most vulnerable in our community who will be the recipients of this basic human right....Water.

Many of us have options and choices. For the poor, options are something that many do not have. Limited choices. Limited resources. These two things are what bring unbalance to a person's life in areas of health and other daily needs.

The collection of water addresses our charitable foot for social justice and outreach. Our justice foot addresses policies and legislation that affect the common good so we may become a healthier and more equitable society.

This year our collection drive for cases of water takes place during the month of May only so that we may have the water available to our partners in need for their clients. **The collection begins on the weekend of May 4/5 and concludes on the May 25/26 weekend.**


