Dear Friends,

The seasons of Lent (40 days) and Easter (50 days) are movable on the Church calendar. This year Lent begins this Wednesday, February 14, with Ash Wednesday, while Easter will be March 31. This is really early for us.

Many people will be coming to church to receive ashes on their foreheads and the ashes will be made in the sign of the cross. At our parish we ask everyone a question, "will you turn away from sin, and be faithful to the Gospel?" This gives everyone an opportunity to say "yes" to the discipline of Lent.

We offer two Masses that day, 8:00 am and 12:05 pm (live stream/on demand). Ashes will be distributed during the Mass. We offer what is called Word Services, this means prayers, the Ash Wednesday scriptures, a homily, blessing of the ashes and then distribution of ashes. The Word Service takes about one half hour. We offer 6:30 am (daily Mass chapel) 10:00 am, 4:15 pm and 5:30 pm (all in the church).

We have one priest for confession from 1:00 - 3:00 pm on Ash Wednesday.

We will have a Lent/Easter bulletin available to hand out with all the information about Lent/Easter. There is a resource table in the Narthex for more materials to have and even to send to loved ones.

I invited everyone to be open to the disciplines of Lent so that at Easter we have grown even more in our faith.

Stewardship

There was quite possibly no worse disease to be afflicted with in all the Bible, than leprosy. Beyond the physical trauma caused by this skin affliction, mental anguish was also a huge factor, since those who fell ill were completely ostracized by the community.

Because it was such a contagious and disastrous disease, lepers were forced to live outside the community so they wouldn't infect others. They had to signal others of their approaching presence by screaming, "Unclean! Unclean!" as we hear in this week's first reading. The leper lived a life of quiet desperation, unable to enter the Temple to worship, interact with loved ones, or have normal relationships.

The fact that Jesus stretches out his hand to the leper in the gospel is more than a mirror break of social and religious convention; It was like signing his own death warrant! The astonishment that falls the crowd here affirms the stigma that accompanied leprosy. The immediate cleansing of the leper demonstrated God's power over not only the disease but also cultural norms and religious laws.

Jesus did not perform this miraculous healing to draw attention to himself, as evidenced by his admonition not to tell anyone what happened. Christ wanted his Father to get all the glory, just as St. Paul spoke about in the second reading. We must not get weighed down by human pride and cultural thinking. Instead, we should put our energy into making sure our actions always point back to God (as we hear in the psalm) and seeking his glory.





Gale Sayers, Running Back for the Chicago Bears

(Born) May 30, 1943 -(Died) September 23, 2020

"You're gonna rock the boat, Sayers. And the people out there are already seasick..." (from the movie Brian's Song, when Gale Sayers was told he was going to room with white roommate and fellow running back Brian Piccolo when traveling for road games).

Titled "I Am Third," Gale Sayers wrote his autobiography when he was 27 years old. It encapsulates the relationship between him and teammate Brian Piccolo as well as the discrimination and injury struggles that Gale endured playing in the NFL. His novel was also the inspiration for the movie "Brian's Song." The title of the autobiography is based on the philosophy: My Lord is first, my friends are second, and I am third. The book was written after both a devastating knee injury Gale suffered in 1968 and Brian Piccolo's death from cancer in 1970.

Born in Wichita, Kansas, Sayers came from a family that struggled financially and ended up moving nine times in eight years. He had attended a two-room schoolhouse in Speed, Kansas which is ironic, seeing that he eventually went on to play at the University of Kansas in 1961 and acquired the nickname "The Kansas Comet" because of his agility and speed on the playing field. Sayers never did finish college but was signed by the Chicago Bears to a four-year contract in 1965 for \$25,000 per year! He won the NFL Rookie of the Year honors in 1965 and set numerous records, including scoring six touchdowns in a mud soaked game against the S.F. 49ers.

Life turned sideways for Sayers in 1968 when he suffered extensive ligament damage to his knee during a game which nearly ended his career. Yet, his tenacity to return helped him to persist and play again. It was fellow roommate, friend, and teammate Brian Piccolo who advocated and inspired Gale to get his career back on track. In 1969, Sayers was awarded Comeback Player of the Year. It was almost unheard of in those days for a white man and a black man to room together, yet their friendship endured. They rocked the boat and their friendship endured. Sayers went on to play until 1972 and retired from the NFL at the age of 29.

Gale was married to his second wife Ardythe Bullard for 47 years before his death in 2020 from complications of Alzheimer's Disease. They were philanthropists that supported causes through the Gale Sayers Foundation for underserved students, the Boys & Girls Clubs, Boy Scouts, and the American Cancer Society.




