
In Luke 5:1-11, we see the story of Jesus calling His first disciples. Simon Peter and his fellow fishermen had worked all night without success, yet at Jesus'

Have you been BAPTIZED but never received your CONFIRMATION? Now might be the right time to receive your final Sacrament of Initiation.

All you need to do is show up on Feb. 15, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm with your Baptism Certificate, sponsor (if they can come), and Birth Certificate. If you need a bit more time to get your Baptism Certificate or Birth Certificate, Dr. Lenny will work with you to get it done.

Dr. Lenny Kelley is doing a one-morning Sacrament of Confirmation workshop for all Baptized Catholics. I know many of you have been thinking about receiving your Confirmation for some time because you have told me. Now is your chance.

The Actual Confirmation will happen at the Easter Vigil (April 19) or when the Confirmation Mass is scheduled by the Diocese of Phoenix Bishop's office (TBD).

What do you need to do to receive your Confirmation?

- 1. Register by emailing Ikelley@stpatcc.org with the subject line reading "Adult Confirmation."
- 2. Get your Baptism Certificate from the parish you were baptized.
- 3. Send your Baptism Certificate to Ikelley@stpatcc.org or bring it with you on Feb. 15.
- 4. Attend the Easter Vigil or when the Bishop is here (TBD), and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.


St. Martin de Porres: A Life of Compassion and Service

St. Martin de Porres (1579-1639) was a Dominican lay brother from Lima, Peru, known for his deep faith, humility, and compassion. Born to a freed African woman and a Spanish nobleman, Martin faced prejudice and discrimination due to his mixed-race heritage. Despite these challenges, he became the first black saint of the Americas, celebrated for his selfless service to the poor, sick, and marginalized. Martin entered the Dominican Order at the age of 24, initially serving as a lay brother, which allowed him to live a life dedicated to prayer, service, and caring for the needs of the marginalized. He was particularly known for his work with the poor, the sick, and animals. Martin cared for the homeless, nursed the ill, and even tended to animals in need, often performing

His deep spiritual life was characterized by simplicity and humility. Martin is often depicted in religious art with a broom, symbolizing his humble service, and surrounded by animals, reflecting his love for all creatures.

miracles of healing.

Martin de Porres was beatified in 1837 and canonized by Pope John XXIII in 1962. He is the patron saint of social justice, race relations, and those suffering from poverty and illness. His life serves as an enduring example of love, humility, and the power of service to others.


