Dear Friends,

There are three sacraments that, when received, we are fully initiated into the Catholic family. The sacraments are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Eucharist completes initiation. Confirmation can be very confusing for many people as Bishops in their own Diocese can set the age requirement to receive Confirmation. Traditionally it was right at baptism, as a sealing of the Holy Spirit received with baptism. Different decisions for each Diocese cause some people to

miss or not receive the sacrament of confirmation. So every year at this time we invite any baptized adult who has not been confirmed to please contact us for a very brief preparation and to receive the sacrament at Easter time. If any parishioner knows people who have missed this sacrament, it might be a good opportunity to invite them to inquire about receiving this sacrament.

You may contact Lenny Kelly at the parish office or email him at **Ikelley@spatcc.org**, to have a conversation on how to begin this process for Confirmation. We are glad to help people participate in the sacramental life of the community.

Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

The Angelia Doctor: St. Thomas Aquinas

On Tuesday the 28th, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Thomas Aquinas. St. Thomas is considered a doctor of the Church because of his extensive contributions to theology and our understanding of the faith. The story of his life is really quite amazing and his dedication to prayer and seeking the truth is equally extraordinary.

One of his most well-known works is called the Summa Theologica. The very structure of the Summa can teach us a lot. Aquinas follows a cycle beginning with God, then goes on to discuss creation, man's purpose, Christ, and then the Sacraments which lead us back to God. Interestingly enough, Aguinas doesn't begin with Christ and doesn't even discuss his impact until the end of his work. Aguinas begins with "beatitude," that is the perfect fulfillment of humanity and the ultimate goal of human life. He begins with this understanding of God and beatitude and secondly moves on to the means by which man can reach that end. This reflects the journey of faith for many as we first discover who God is and then journey closer and closer to him.

For Aquinas, man himself has a distinct knowledge of God which allows him to reach his end by use of his intellect and will. This becomes the crux of Aquinas' work. Humans are unique in their ability to reason, consequently it is proper to their rational nature that they tend towards an end by directing themselves by actions through use of their free will. Our knowledge of God, our use of reason, and our free will are all necessary to know God and grow in

closer union with him. Our understanding of God, our faith, and the way we choose to act are all aspects of us living out the gospel.

For Aquinas, faith and reason are intimately connected to one another. Although he spent much of his life writing many great works, at the heart of his writing is the intimate relationship he had with God. We can learn from Aquinas because he shows us we should never be afraid to ask questions. Especially when it comes to our faith, we should never be afraid to ask questions. As Catholics we believe faith and reason go hand in hand. There is no contradiction between the two.

As another week goes by, I pose these questions: What are you doing to learn more about your faith? What questions do you have about an issue of the Church, and what are you doing to find the answer?

If you are interested in learning more about your faith, St. Patrick is currently offering a series called Catholic 101 for those interested in learning more about theology and the teachings of the Church. 

Have you been BAPTIZED but never received your CONFIRMATION? Now might be the right time to receive your final Sacrament of Initiation.

All you need to do is show up on Feb. 15, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm with your Baptism Certificate, sponsor (if they can come), and Birth Certificate. If you need a bit more time to get your Baptism Certificate or Birth Certificate, Dr. Lenny will work with you to get it done.

Dr. Lenny Kelley is doing a one-morning Sacrament of Confirmation workshop for all Baptized Catholics. I know many of you have been thinking about receiving your Confirmation for some time because you have told me. Now is your chance.




