Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

St. Benedict: The Father of Western Monasticism

On Thursday July 11, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Benedict of Nursia. St. Benedict made a lasting impact in the early life of the Church and is often referred to as the "Father of Western Monasticism". Born in 480 to a wealthy family, Benedict was sent to study in Rome where he was confronted by the loose morals of the other students. After a short time Benedict left the world to live a solitary life at Subiaco. After living in a cave in the mountains for two years as a hermit, he had acquired such a reputation that disciples came in numbers to join him and important Roman families entrusted him with the education of their children. He then organized a form of life for those who joined him and under his guidance the monks vowed to seek God and devoted themselves to work and prayer. A few years later he founded the great abbey of Monte Casino on a hilltop in Campania, Italy. His monastic movement soon attracted more and more people who were looking to live their faith more deeply. He wanted to create a model of monastic life that would make it possible for ordinary men to follow every day. He also wanted to create a community with the abbot as the father guiding the monks in the daily practice of work and prayer. This became central to Benedictine spirituality, ora et labora, work and pray.

One of the most important aspects of St. Benedict's rule of life was "prefer nothing to the love of Christ." St. Benedict was a prime example of what loving God above all else looks like. To prefer nothing to the love of Christ means always putting Christ first, it means trusting in the providence of God. This is never an easy thing to do but by making work and prayer a means of encountering God, we see how God is present in every moment of life. By centering God in our life, even the daily work we do can become transformed into bringing us closer to God. Benedict also viewed hospitality as a vital part of Christian living. He encourages, "let all guests who arrive be received as Christ." This is another great example and reminder of how we are challenged to recognize Christ in the stranger.

St. Benedict died in 547 but left a lasting impression on the Church and the entire world. St. Benedict shows how community, work, and prayer are essential to growing in relation with God. I encourage you this week to learn more about the life of St. Benedict, and why it is so important for us to prefer nothing to the love of Christ.

This passage highlights our call to be missionary disciples, sent forth to use our gifts in service of the Gospel. upon returning—celebrating not just their success, but their belonging in the Kingdom reminds us that true stewardship flows from relationship with Christ and results in lasting spiritual fruit.
