Dear Friends,

As we enter the summer months, there is an opportunity to look at what changes need to be made for the beginning of the fall season. I want to announce some exciting changes in our parish staff.

I have asked Sue Orlando to take on the position of Parish Administrator. She is currently in the position of Human Resources and Database. She has a long history of working in the Diocese in different positions. I trust her; she is loyal to the parish vision, and we can work well together.

I have asked Eric Tamayo, our Pastoral Associate, to be our full-time Parish Liturgist. Liturgy is one of our pillars, and it takes a full-time person to have Liturgy done well. Pope Leo XIV has stated that social justice will be important in his papacy, and St. Patrick understands that Catholic Social Teaching is rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I feel confident in these hirings, and we have more positions to fill this summer. We are looking to strengthen our five pillars (liturgy, social justice, hospitality, formation, and stewardship), and we are on our way to keep improving.

The Ascension

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension. God the Father exalts Jesus after his death raising him as the first of the dead and taking Him to Heaven where he is seated at the right hand of the Father. The Ascension reminds us not to place our hope in the things of this world but rather in heaven. As Jesus assured his disciples, we should take confidence in the promise of Jesus who has prepared a place for us in heaven. Jesus precedes us into the Father's kingdom so that we, as members of his body, may live in hope of one day being with him. It is his love that sustains us and comforts us in our daily lives.

The Ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain. As he is lifted up from the earth he draws all of humanity into himself and we share in his glory. Being seated at the Father's right hand signifies the fulfillment of the prophet David's vision concerning the Son of man, "To him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed." The Apostles witnessing this event testifies to the glory of

God and the everlasting hope we have in the promise of Christ. Jesus entering the sanctuary of heaven reveals his constant intercession for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit. This of course prepares us for Pentecost which we will celebrate next week.

The departure from Jesus from the earth may seem like a time of waiting for when he will return again. But the time we have on earth shouldn't simply be a time of waiting, rather it is a time for preparation. The Ascension gives us a glimpse of Jesus' eternal promise, but if Christ appeared to you now would you be prepared? Unfortunately, we don't have the chance to experience Jesus on this earth like the Apostles did, but we can still have a relationship with him. We can still talk to him and experience him in our lives. The Ascension is a sign for us that Jesus is truly our mediator and will never abandon us. He sustains us and offers us comfort each day if we are open to receiving it.

TIME TOGETHER:

- + Spend some time outside with your grandchildren enjoying the wonders of nature. A butterfly, a blooming rose, a ladybug, and even a feather are all part of God's plan. Find a few rocks and bring them inside to paint together. God is our rock; He is strong and unchanging.
- + FaceTime a story. Whether you are close or far away, find a consistent time each week to read your grandchild a story (in person or via a screen). Collect books and write down a couple of questions to ask them. This can become a family tradition!
- + Have time stand still for a moment. Ask your grandchild some questions about their life: their age, their three favorite friends, favorite food, favorite movie, etc. Write down all their answers and seal it in an envelope with the date on top.

Inspiration, Ideas, and Encouragement for Grandparents

CREATE A SIMPLE PRAYER SPACE TOGETHER

Setting up a small sacred space in your home with your grandchildren can be a great way to mark a space for prayer when they visit. First, find a small spot on a table or nook and use a cloth to anchor the space. Add a Bible, cross or crucifix, sacred images, and any other faith statues or mementos that you have. As you place these in the space, share stories about your different items. Have your grandchildren fill a vase with water and cut some flowers to fill it. Our Mother Mary loves to be surrounded by flowers. You may also want to add a candle. When your grandchildren visit, use this spot to say a short prayer or give a blessing. Let them help you take care of the space; this may encourage them to create a space in their own room at home as well.

Recipe:

Mini Apple Pie Bites!

- -1/2 cup sugar
- -2 tsp. ground cinnamon
- -2 sheets refrigerated pie crust
- -3 tbsp. butter (mefted and divided)
- -2 medium tart apples
- -Caramel sauce (optional)

Preheat oven to 425°. In a small bowl, mix sugar and cinnamon. On a lightly floured surface, unroll pie crusts. Roll and trim each to an 8 inch square. Brush with 2 tablespoons of butter and sprinkle with half of the sugar mixture. Cut each square into eight 1 inch strips. Cut each apple into 8 wedges and wrap one strip of pastry around each wedge, placing sugared side of pastry against the apple. Place on a parchment-lined baking sheet. Brush tops with remaining butter and sprinkle with remaining sugar mixture. Bake for 13-15 minutes or until pastry is golden brown. Serve warm with caramel sauce!


