Stewardship

The world craves intimacy. Sadly, the word "intimate" has lost its proper connotation in modern culture. Real intimacy, at its core, is far more about the spirit than the flesh. From the Latin intimus, "intimate" means to "make the innermost known."

The world craves a love that is completely trustworthy, safe, and true. To make our innermost hearts, fears, struggles, pains, and anxieties known to another is frightening because it can be taken advantage of and betrayed. Most heartbreak stems from a desire for intimacy that has been mishandled.

True prayer is intimate. The sacraments are intimate. The Holy Trinity offers us perfect intimacy because pure love can only give of itself and takes nothing in return. In this way, the Holy Trinity is, obviously, perfect intimacy because all three persons (and one God) are perfect love.

Today's first reading demonstrates God's desire for intimacy with us which is why He came near to Moses and, incidentally, why He gave us the Ten Commandments — to keep us in right relationship with Himself. Saint Paul's second letter to the Corinthians not only demonstrates his deep, personal love for them but gives instruction on how they are to grow in holy intimacy with one another. God, in giving us His only Son to save us, not only demonstrated His love for Christ but His great love for us — His sinful, but beloved children. God offers us Himself in love, grace and fellowship. Humility accepts the proposal while pride rejects it and Him.

Do you view intimacy differently after reflecting on the readings? How can you start making your life more intimate with God and our mission of being Christian Disciples in Mission?

Do you have an empathetic heart and truly care for people going through tough times? If so, then Stephen's ministry might be the right ministry for you!


Stephen's Ministry provides high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the parish and community experiencing difficult times.

Stephen Ministers are parish members trained by their Stephen Leaders to offer care to people who are hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week for about an hour.

Care receivers are individuals in the parish or community who are going through a crisis or life difficulty. Potential care receivers first meet with a Stephen Leader, who assesses their needs for care and matches them with a Stephen Minister. The caring relationship lasts for as long as the need persists.

Point-In-Time Count

What is the PIT Count? The Point-In-Time Homeless Count is an annual street and shelter count that determines the number of people experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County during a given point in time. Conducted on a single day in January (this year it was January 24), this project includes a brief survey to identify the needs and characteristics of those experiencing homelessness. Every Continuum of Care is required to submit PIT Count results to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as part of a national effort to identify the extent of homelessness across the country.

As you look at the graph on the previous page, you will see a number corresponding to the terms sheltered and unsheltered.

Think of the term unsheltered as a person who does not have any type of sustainable structure over their heads. It is a living space that is not meant for human habitation. This may consist of an abandoned building, a car, a tent, public park, sidewalk, or a desert wash for example.

The term sheltered generally refers to a more sustainable structure, designed as a temporary place, but it provides better protection from the outdoor elements and exposure. This can be an emergency shelter, transitional housing, or a safe haven facility for example. Both of these terms are used for those experiencing homelessness. They have no permanent housing option.

The total count for 2023 for both sheltered and unsheltered is 9,642 persons who are experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County alone. Since 2017, there has been a steady increase when that number was 5,605. 


