Dear Friends,

I want to thank parishioners who have supported GET ON THE BUS with your monetary gifts to this great ministry. On May 9, our parish welcomed over 300 guests with breakfast and arts and craft tables for the children who were taking buses to see their mothers and grandmothers at the Women's Prison in Perryville.

Thanks to 100 parishioners, the Knights of Columbus, the Lady Knights of Columbus, the Men's Club, and the Mom's Group, who provided great hospitality to the families who participated in this special day. GET ON THE BUS provided

seven buses, three counselors from Catholic Charities, so that the families had a good day with their loved ones.

The founder from California provided the resources to make this happen, and he recently died. This ministry has been supported so well by many parishioners, and I feel that we can contribute to its ongoing success. It takes about \$15,000 each year, and we provided specially marked envelopes for parishioners to support this ministry. On Mother's Day, so many people took envelopes that they ran out. So any envelope or check given to us marked GET ON THE BUS will be given to that ministry. Any amount over \$15,000 will be reserved only for that ministry to be used in the coming years. This should keep this ministry going for a good while.

I am grateful to the parish and the ministry that we have provided in the past to the prison, and we would like to continue and increase our ministry to the men and women in prisons.

# The Holy Spirit: The Advocate

In this week's Gospel we hear the Holy Spirit referred to as "The Advocate". The Holy Spirit is called the Advocate because He pleads and intercedes with God the Father on behalf of believers. In Greek the word is "Paraclete," and it literally means someone who comes alongside us. It can also be translated as "helper" or "comforter." Drawing from this we can begin to see the role of the Holy Spirit in our own lives.

For many of us I think it can be a struggle to understand the Holy Spirit and the role the Spirit plays in our lives. We see the Father and the Son but then we have the guestion "what is the Holy Spirit?" But even that is the wrong question. We shouldn't be asking what is the Holy Spirit but rather 'who is the Holy Spirit'? As humans we often need to visualize who we are talking about. I think for many of us when we think of the Father we revert to the classical image of Michelangelo's depiction of God in the Sistine Chapel. An older Man with flowing long white hair. Then there is the Son, Jesus who we are familiar with, then there is the Holy Spirit. In scripture we see the Spirit in the form of a dove or in fire, but it leaves us missing a personal connection. The Holy Spirit is the very love shared between the Father and Son. It is hard to comprehend but it is at the center of our faith.

When I was in confirmation class, I remember my teacher talking about the Holy Spirit and relating the Holy Spirit to "the Force" in Star

Wars. At the time I said "well ok I guess so" but that analogy really fell short. It lacks the relationality and the personhood of the Spirit. If it is not personal in nature, it is not God. The Holy Spirit is not just there in the background but rather the Holy Spirit is actively involved in our salvation. From the very start of our life until the end, the Holy Spirit is at work guiding us to heaven. The point is, whether we realize it or not, the Holy Spirit is always at work within us. Think about your confirmation, when the gifts of the Holy Spirit were stirred up inside you and confirmed. Jesus gives the Church the gift of the Holy Spirit and the Spirit is always with us. The Holy Spirit dwells in the very depths of our soul. As St. Paul tells us we are "temples of the Holy Spirit".... Do we live up to that reality?

Calling the Holy Spirit "The Advocate" suggests that when we are struggling, he comes to be with us in our struggles and helps us. He comes to counsel and comfort us. In the Bible the devil is called "the Accuser." He accuses us day and night in God's presence of all our sins (Rev 12:10). But the Holy Spirit is called "the Advocate." In the Spirit we are children of God, and we receive the Lord's mercy and forgiveness. The Spirit brings us the comfort of God's forgiveness, and eventually, the power and the wisdom to actually change. Whether we realize it or not, we are temples of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is always with us, and so we can take confidence in calling Him our Advocate.


